A person with a disability and their support person are both permitted to enter HKPR premises together and the person with a disability will not be prevented from having access to the support person while on the premises.

HKPR will consult with the person with a disability to be accompanied by a support person when on the premises, but only if, after consulting with the person with a disability and considering the available evidence, HKPR determines that,

- a) a support person is necessary to protect the health or safety of the person with a disability or the health or safety of others on the premises; and
- b) there is no other reasonable way to protect the health or safety of the person with the disability and the health or safety of others on the premises.
