



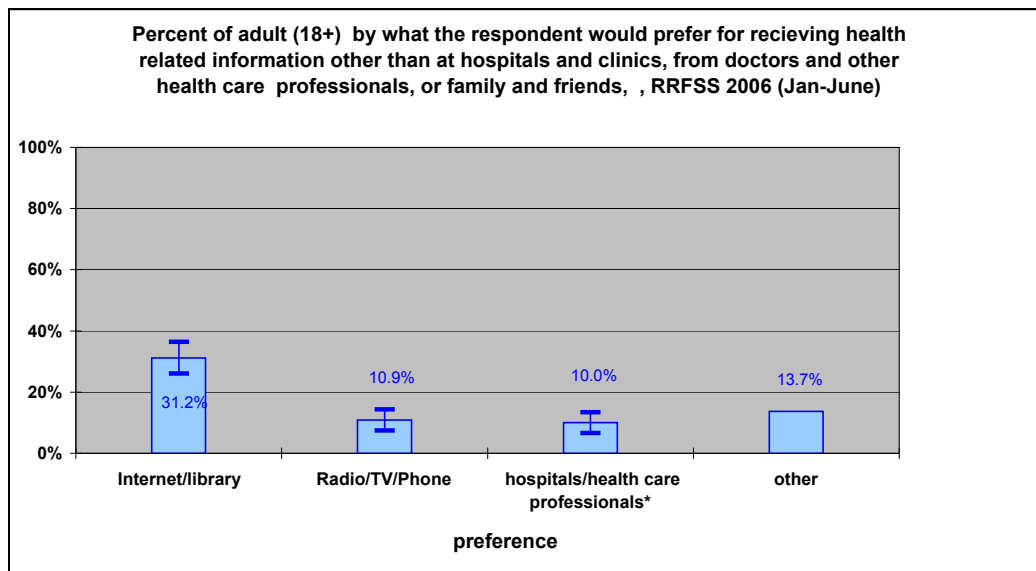

sample size 306



31.2%	(+/- 5.2%)	adults (age 18+) reported that they would prefer receiving health information through internet/library
10.9%	(+/- 3.4%)	adults (age 18+) reported that they would prefer receiving information through radio/TV/Phone
10.0%	(+/- 3.5%)	adults (age 18+) insisted that they would prefer receiving information through hospitals/health care professionals
13.7%	(+/- 3.9%)	adults (age 18+) reported that they preferred receiving health related information by other means

Limitations:

1. Questions only asked of adult residents aged 18+
2. Telephone survey only conducted in English
3. Results are based on self-reported behaviors.
4. (*) indicates that results are based on small sample size, thus estimates have high variability.

Notes:

- 1) The numbers in the tables and graphs are weighted.
- 2) Missing responses are not included in the analysis.
- 3) Don't know and refused responses are analyzed according to RRFSS analysis guideline.
- 4) Release criteria of the data is according to RRFSS analysis guideline.
