



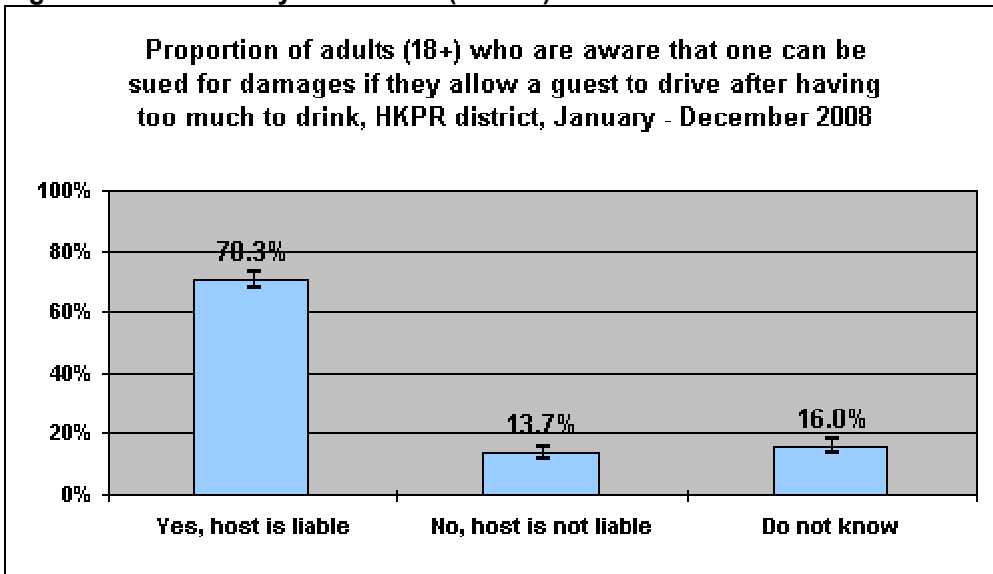

Interpretation:

70.3% (+/-3%) of adults (18+) reported that they are aware that a host can be sued for damages if they allow a guest to drive after having too much to drink.

13.7% (+/-2%) of adults (18+) reported that they were not aware that a host can be sued for damages if they allow a guest to drive after having too much to drink.

16.0% (+/-2%) of adults (18+) reported that they do not know if a host can be sued for damages if they allow a guest to drive after having too much to drink.

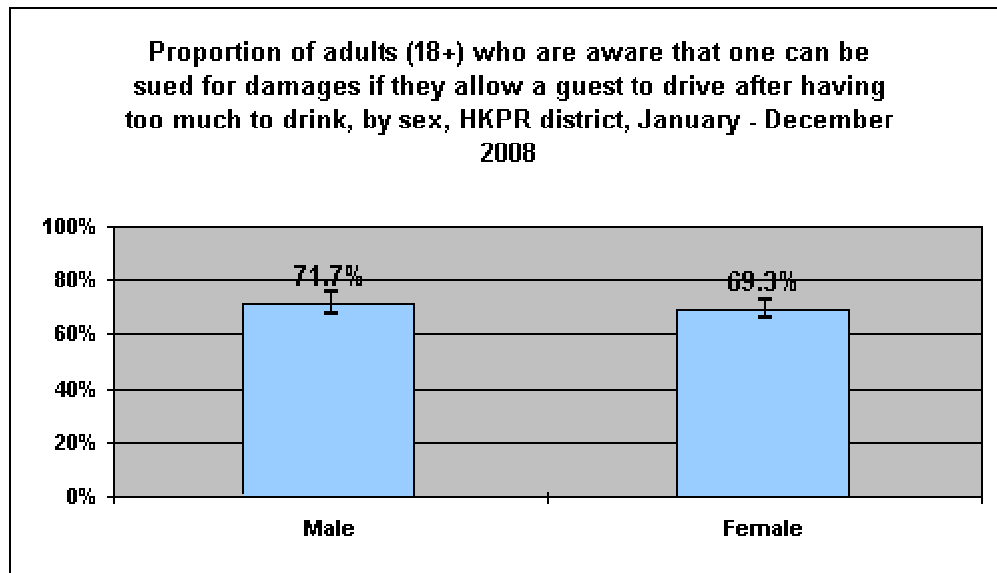

Interpretation:

71.7% (+/-4%) of adult males (18+) reported that they are aware that a host can be sued for damages if they allow a guest to drive after having too much to drink.

69.3% (+/-3%) of adult females (18+) reported that they are aware that a host can be sued for damages if they allow a guest to drive after having too much to drink.

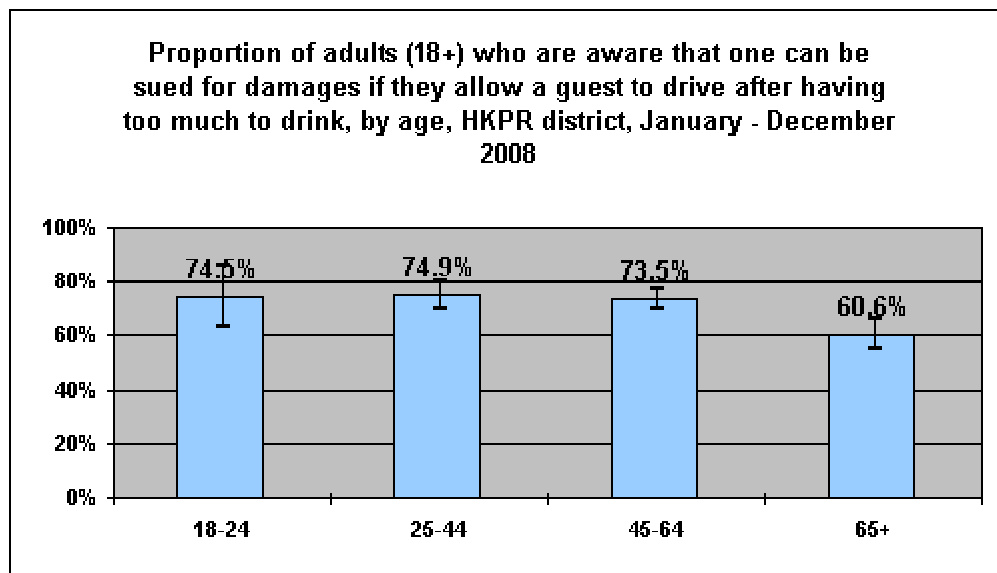

Interpretation:

74.5% (+/-11%) of adults (age 18-24) reported that they are aware that a host can be sued for damages if they allow a guest to drive after having too much to drink.

74.9% (+/-5%) of adults (age 25-44) reported that they are aware that a host can be sued for damages if they allow a guest to drive after having too much to drink.

73.5% (+/-4%) of adults (age 45-64) reported that they are aware that a host can be sued for damages if they allow a guest to drive after having too much to drink.

60.6% (+/-5%) of adults (age 65+) reported that they are aware that a host can be sued for damages if they allow a guest to drive after having too much to drink.

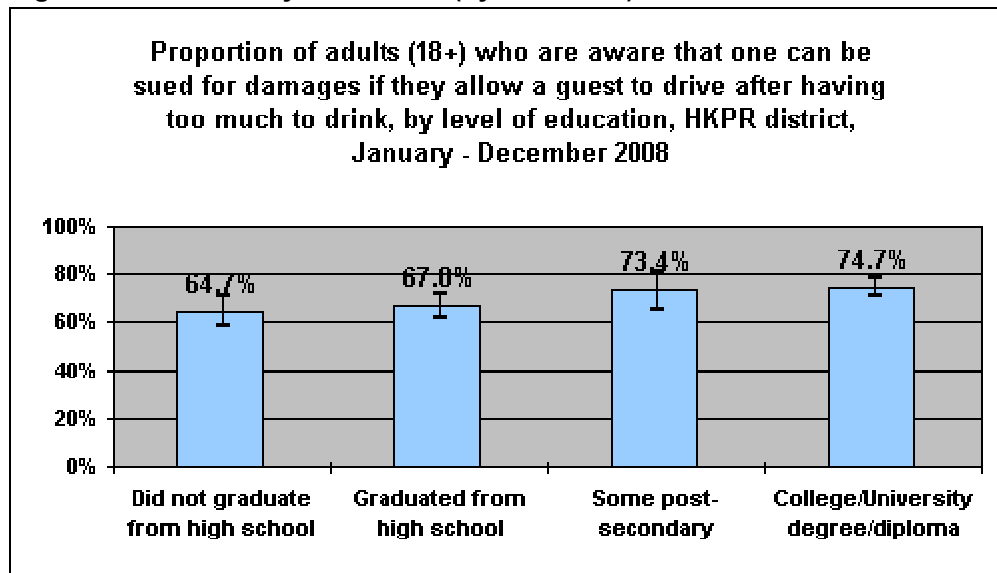

| Host is liable | Proportion | 95% upper confidence limit | 95% lower confidence limit |

| Did not graduate from high school | 64.7% | 70.9% | 58.5% |
| Graduated from high school | 67.0% | 72.0% | 62.0% |
| Some post-secondary | 73.4% | 81.3% | 65.5% |
| College/University degree/diploma | 74.7% | 78.5% | 70.9% |

Interpretation:

64.7% (+/-6%) of adults (18+) who have not graduated from high school reported that they are aware that a host can be sued for damages if they allow a guest to drive after having too much to drink.

67% (+/-5%) of adults (18+) who have graduated from high school reported that they are aware that a host can be sued for damages if they allow a guest to drive after having too much to drink.

73.4% (+/-8%) of adults (18+) who have graduated from high school and have completed some post-secondary education reported that they are aware that a host can be sued for damages if they allow a guest to drive after having too much to drink.

74.7% (+/-4%) of adults (18+) who have completed a college or university degree or diploma reported that they are aware that a host can be sued for damages if they allow a guest to drive after having too much to drink.

Limitations:

1. Questions are only asked of adult residents aged 18+.
2. Telephone survey only conducted in English.
3. Results are based on self-reported behaviours.
4. (*) indicates that results are based on small sample size, thus estimates have high variability.

Notes:

- 1) The numbers in the tables and graphs are weighted.
 - 2) Missing responses are not included in the analysis.
 - 3) 'Don't Know' and 'Refused' responses are analyzed according to RRFSS Analysis Guidelines.
 - 4) Release criteria of the data are according to RRFSS Analysis Guidelines.
