Percent of adults (18+), that supports/opposes banning the display of cigarettes and other tobacco products in stores, RRFSS 2006 (Jan-Dec)

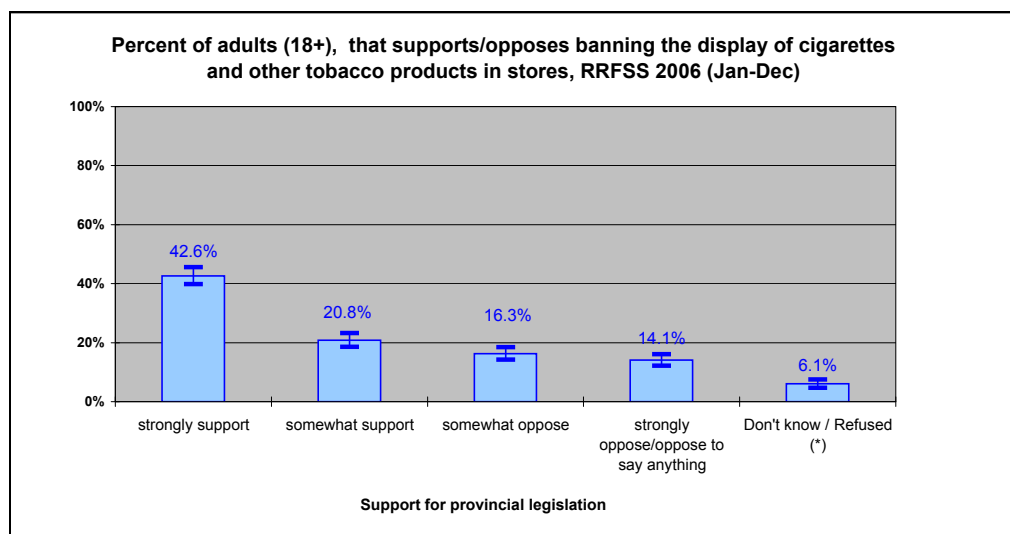

#### Interpretation:

- 42.6% (+/-2.8%) adults (age 18+) strongly support banning the display of cigarettes and other tobacco products in stores
- 20.8% (+/-2.3%) adults (age 18+) somewhat supports banning the display of cigarettes and other tobacco products in stores
- 16.3% (+/-2.1%) adults (age 18+)somewhat oppose banning the display of cigarettes and other tobacco products in stores
- 14.1% (+/-2.0%) adults (age 18+) strongly oppose banning the display of cigarettes and other tobacco products in stores
- 6.1% (+/-1.4%) adults (age 18+) did not respond/refused to answer

**Limitations:**

1. Questions only asked of adult residents, aged 18+
2. Telephone survey only conducted in English
3. Results are based on self-reported behaviors.
4. (\*) indicates that results are based on small sample size, thus estimates have high variability.

**Notes:**

- 1) The numbers in the tables and graphs are weighted.
- 2) Missing responses are not included in the analysis.
- 3) Don't know and refused responses are analyzed according to RRFSS analysis guideline.
- 4) Release criteria of the data is according to RRFSS analysis guideline.
